Regional Activities. Since our last Newsletter I have had the opportunity and privilege to attend various AGM's and functions of some of our Regions – East Rand, Johannesburg, Jacaranda, Garden Route and the Northern Free State. It was throughout fascinating to see the levels of friendship that exist amongst IPA members, their families and friends of the IPA. Although all Regions face various challenges, it was once again noticeable that the cause of the IPA is sound and second to none. Let us build on this and live out our Motto of "Servo per Amikeco – Service through Friendship".

First of all they were taken to view the stunning Beacon Island Hotel situated on the rocks between Central Beach and Robberg Beach.


Thereafter they were accompanied to several view spots overlooking the town and beaches.

The Race Day at Kennilworth has been a fund raising event for the Region for many many many years. And it has always been a fun filled day and this time was no exception.



IPA POEM COMPETITION 2014-2015

The International Police Association's Poem Competition 2014-2015 was hosted by the International Cultural Commission (ICC), and poems were submitted to the ICC by the authors' national secretaries general by the deadline of 30 June 2015.

32 poems were received

- > 27 for the category 'Traditional' from the IPA sections of Australia, Austria, Canada, Cyprus, Finland, France, Germany, Malta, Romania, Russia, South Africa, Sweden and the UK.
- > 5 poems were received for the 'Haiku' category from Austria, Finland and Russia.

The authors' names and sections were removed, a code was given to each poem, and the identifying information was kept safe by Eija Aspholm of the ICC. The coded poems, plus the rules and a comments form were then emailed to the reviewers, who made their decisions not knowing the identities of the authors and sections.

All reviewers were asked to comment and give a position to the poems. This was followed by Eija Aspholm analysing the results.

The reviewers were Helena Kalema, a retired Sergeant and editor of the 'Veteraanit' magazine (police veterans), and Jutta Purontaus, Departmental Secretary in the Police Department of the Ministry of Interior from Finland. In addition, Stephen and Dianne Crockard assisted by giving comments on the Haiku poems.

The results of the competition were announced during the recent IPA World Congress in Cyprus and are as follows:



IPA SPAIN "MOTOFORPEACE"

I am Celestino Suárez, an IPA member from Spain. I am also a member of another European Police organization called "Motoforpeace".

Motoforpeace is non-governmental organization formed by European police and each year supports a humanitarian project and travels the world on motorcycles carrying a message of peace and friendship between the police of the world.

Motoforpeace was born in 2000 and so far has traveled the world covering more than 100,000 km on motorcycles and supporting humanitarian projects in Africa, Asia and South America.

The whole history of travel and projects to date can be found on the web <u>www.motoforpeace.it</u>. Next year we will contribute towards three humanitarian projects:

- Construction of an orphanage in Bolivia (We will make the donation to NPH American organization founded by Father William B. born in Phoenix, Arizona.)
- Donation for drugs for one year for handicapped children orphans, they are treated at the Rancho Santa Fe NPH Honduras.
- Donation for drugs for one year for children living in the dump of Tegucigalpa

We will also travel with a medical team of the Italian police who will remain in Honduras three weeks practicing interventions.

The second part of our project is to have a motorcycle tour from Panama to Canada. The group is formed by 13 motorcycles and two vans with a total of approximately 20 people.

The journey begins on March 13 in Panama and arrive in New York on the 5th of May.

We are looking for assistance with places to sleep. Elsewhere in the world we have been received in police schools, Police stations or army, or as a last resort, not very expensive hotel.
