



It was vital to avoid politics, religion and all other controversial subjects. I considered that friendship transcended all. It was this very simplicity which was the key to the acceptance and eventual success of The International Police Association.

My first real friendships were established abroad in Holland, Belgium, Denmark and Norway. But then the idea certainly started to "snowball". The start had been made.

We all had similar views about the future of peace and freedom, a fact which had brought us together in the first place. We wanted to do what we could in our small way to bring about a better world.

Whatever our ideological feelings or religious views, and these were naturally varying, we all believed that we could spread our simple message of FRIENDSHIP to other parts of the world".

And Arthur Troop founded the IPA! What a visionary and a great man.

Away from politics, fights and all other controversial subjects, let's make our own footprints on the path set by our founder. Let's put Friendship in the middle of our concerns and ensure that the snowball keeps getting bigger...

Happy Arthur Troop's day to all of you on December 15th, his birthday, and Long live IPA!

IPA Kazakhstan: Proud to be a full member of the international police community



The idea of creating a national section of the International Police Association in Kazakhstan was born five years ago – on 10 November 2009. That same day ten veterans of the Kazakh police held an internal constitutive meeting, where it was decided to create a national association. As required by the legislation of the Republic of Kazakhstan, we registered with the Ministry of Justice, confirming our status, and within a year we created

eleven branches in different regions of the country.

Following IPA procedures, IPA Russia was appointed sponsor section and worked

with Kazakhstan for two years, leading to the founding meeting of IPA Kazakhstan in July 2012, which was attended by the former International President Michael Odysseos, the International Secretary General Georgios Katsaropoulos and the President of IPA Russia, Aleksey Gankin. Shortly after the founding meeting, IPA Kazakhstan was awarded the status of Section in Foundation.



Considerable organisational and practical

work has been achieved since this time; a constructive and fruitful cooperation was established with our colleagues, members of the police association and other public law enforcement associations in Russia, Ukraine, Belarus and further countries of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS). The board and members of Section IPA Kazakhstan regularly attend events organised by the International Police Association in Moscow, St. Petersburg, Ekaterinburg, Izhevsk, Kirov, Pyatigorsk, Omsk, Minsk and other cities of the CIS.

One major event took place in the summer of 2012: the first international motor rally in Kazakhstan was launched amid celebrations in the capital Astana in the square

near the monument to the defenders of the fatherland. The motor rally was dedicated to the memory of police captain Gaziz Baiatsov, who was posthumously awarded the highest title of the Republic of Kazakhstan 'Hero of Kazakhstan', as well as to the memory of other law enforcement officers who lost their lives in the line of duty.



The participants of the motor rally - veterans of internal affair bodies, members of the International Police Association from Russia, Belarus, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan and representatives from the Ministry of Internal Affairs as well as the Department for the Interior Regions - drove along the route 'Astana - Karaganda - Balhash - Shu - Taraz - Bishkek - Almaty - Astana'.

The motor rally was highly appreciated by the public authorities, the public as well as the International Police Association, and a group of professional film-makers produced a documentary about the event. In addition, and a part of the joint event for the motor rally, a 'Book of Memory', which includes information about the police officers killed since 1991, was released.

On our initiative, to commemorate the heroic death of police captain Gaziz Baiatsov, motor rallies are now being held each year on 12 November in Astana and other cities of Kazakhstan, combined with laying of flowers at the obelisk of dead police officers.

Our work of educating the youth and improving the image of the Kazakh police has been recognized: in 2013, the President of IPA Kazakhstan, Marat Nurgaliev, was



elected as a member of the Public Council in the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

One of the most important events for members of IPA Kazakhstan has been the opening of a new office and museum on 23 June 2013, the 'Day of the Kazakhstan police'. This event was attended by members of the Moscow branch as well as further invited guests.





A high degree of attention is paid to sports activities in our section, and a team of the law enforcement bodies of Kazakhstan took part in the 15th World Police and Fire

Games which was held in the city of Belfast in Northern Ireland in August 2013. Six Kazakhstan athletes won 15 medals: 5 gold, 5 silver and 5 bronze.

Following the good work achieved over the years, the delegates of the 39th IEC Conference in Potsdam voted unanimously for the affiliation of IPA Kazakhstan, therewith granting the section the status of a full member of the International Police Association. The International President Pierre-Martin Moulin presented IPA Kazakhstan with the affiliation certificate.

A press conference was organised in the National Press Club after our return to Kazakhstan during which we informed the people of Kazakhstan about this event. It is a great achievement for IPA Kazakhstan which will without doubt have a significant impact on the revitalization of our work and open new perspectives and opportunities for the police community of Kazakhstan.





The future plans of Section IPA Kazakhstan involve holding joint events with the Ministry of Internal Affairs regarding patriotic education of young police officers and improving the image of police officers, as well as the development and strengthening of international cooperation, strengthening the credibility of our organisation and our country.

The main speakers were all police officers and Senior Governmental officials from the Ministries of Justice and Public Order, Interior & Labour, the office of the Attorney General and the office of the Ombudsman who analysed and developed the seriousness of this type of crime and answered many questions raised during the discussion.

IPA Greece organises 1st IPA Women Police Conference

IPA Greece successfully organised the 1st IPA International Women Police Conference, on the island of Crete from 1-5 October 2014.

218 police officers from around the attended. and during world the sessions 13 scientific papers from university professors and scientists analysed. Police officers exchanged views on the prevention punishment of crime and investigated issues affecting work.



The delegations from Russia, Poland, Cyprus and Brazil also submitted material on issues concerning their countries' police. All participants came to the conclusion that in a modern police force, violence is the exception and not the rule. IPA members belong to a rare category of people united by friendship and who have the talent to bring new ideas and turn them into reality. Our aim is to highlight the purposes of IPA, on a national and international level.

During the Conference, proposals to organise the 2nd IPA Women Police Conference were submitted by IPA Russia and Poland.

Alongside the scientific discussions, participants were able to take part in events showcasing the culture, gastronomy and touristic side of Crete.

IEB representative Gal Sharon, the International Secretary General Georgios Katsaropoulos, the President of the Greek Section Ioannis Karapatakis, delegates of local regions of Greece and representatives of the sections involved paid their respects by depositing a wreath at the monument of Fallen Police Officers at the Police Headquarters in Heraklion.

Retired brigadier Konstantina Basouko, one of the first women in the Greek police force, having started 43 years ago in the Heraklion Security department, was honoured during the conference.

On behalf of the administration board of the Greek Section, we express once again our thanks to the Chief of the Police, the International President and IEB members,

the delegations and all volunteers from the local regions for their collective effort and the big Greek smile we shared during the days of the conference. Such events build strong friendships and create memories for life!

The Resolution of the Conference

On 2 October 2014, the delegations of women police officers reached unanimously a resolution stating their intention to help ensure peace, tranquility and better living conditions for people all over the world and their wish to contribute to the eradication of violence, taking full advantage of the female gender and calling all members of society to work towards this direction.

In addition, the resolution includes the intention for the International Police Association to organise similar conferences on a biennial basis.

Furthermore, all participants invited the international community to eliminate conflicts, racial and religious discrimination, crime and general conditions that cause insecurity and inequality.

IEB Visit to Macau and Hong Kong



Section Macau had invited the IEB for a promotional and professional visit as well as to take part in the anniversary dinner to celebrate 15 years since Macau was returned to China. As the IEB liaison member for Macau, I was honoured to attend and represent the international board of the IPA.

An official meeting was organised with the deputy Commissioner, Mr. Lai Kam Kun and members of his staff, during which I was able

to speak about the scope of our organisation. His head of international relations was particularly interested in our International World Seminar for Young Police Officers (YPOS), and I was able to explain in detail past seminars as well as provide him with information regarding the 3rd YPOS which IPA Poland is organising next year.

The Deputy Commissioner expressed his support for Section Macau and appreciated their work. He was prepared to support any initiative from IPA Macau to organise a Young Police Officers Seminar in the future.

Section Macau also arranged an informal meeting with the police of the city of Zhuhai in mainland China. This meeting lasted 45 minutes, and I was not surprised that police work in this part of China is the same as in other parts of the world. The main differences can be found in the processes and the structure of the organisation.

I was able to talk about our Association and the aims of the IPA.

Approximately 960 people took part in the annual celebration dinner on 1 November 2014. An informal meeting took place with representatives from Mali, Indonesia and Laos. We discussed the IPA, including its foundations and its aims.

A meeting with the NEC of Macau revealed that they are involved in many supporting projects and fundraising activities. In addition, the section was

and fundraising activities. In addition, the section will look into the possibility of hosting the 5th IPA World Seminar for Young Police Officers in 2019.

A big thank you and compliments to section Macau for their superb work and organisation of this event!



LAST WORD

Lots of ideas came to my mind when thinking about the Last Word for this month; November 2014 has been memorable for me for various reasons, and December 2014 of course marks the centenary of Arthur Troop's birthday.

The most memorable date for me without doubt: 9 November. 25 years since the fall of the Berlin Wall and the entire Iron Curtain. 25 years ago I was at university right in the middle of Germany, not far from the fence that had separated East and West for all of my life. I had grown up with the firm belief that I would not see whoever and whatever was on the other side of the fence, and I felt closer to teenagers from France, England or Holland than to any East Germans – there was simply no opportunity to meet any of them, it was not encouraged.


Not long after the wall came down, a few friends and I crossed the inner-German border. Yes, we had a look at some of the famous sights we had only heard of before, but this is not what was memorable. Memorable and unforgettable were the people: Within minutes, a group of teenagers came up to us, started a conversation, hugged us and invited us to come to a disco with them. Within minutes, it became crystal-clear to me that we had so much in common with these young people who only weeks ago had been our ideological opponents. 25 years ago, my outlook on life changed in an instant: never simply accept the status quo, always have the courage to think differently and dare to hope that you can make a difference.

The motto of the celebrations commemorating 25 years of the Berlin Wall was 'Mut zur Freiheit' – 'the courage to seek Freedom', reminding everyone of those courageous people in East Germany who dared to think differently and who achieved their aim in a peaceful way.

Arthur Troop, in my eyes, was a person with a similar outlook on life. He was driven by the desire to renew friendships from before the Second World War. He

had 'the courage to seek Friendship', culminating in the foundation of the IPA.

I am grateful to Arthur for his courage and for his initiative. Without people like him, I would not be able today to enjoy all the friendships I have made through the IPA – I would not be able look at the photo of Michaela from IPA Slovakia and myself, taken during the recent IEC Conference in Germany, right at the spot where the Wall divided East and West.
